Food Systems and Food Justice in the US - Roni Neff

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 20, 2016, 7 – 9PM, Masters Hall 110 Mara Auditorium

When we decide what to eat, many of us think about flavor, price, nutrition, even environment. But how often do we think about justice? Dr. Neff will provide an overview of the US food system, highlighting particular points of injustice as well as describing powerful movements working for food justice and the human right to adequate food. Dr. Neff will also share examples of successful efforts to create a healthier and more equitable food system.

Roni Neff is an Assistant Professor in John Hopkins University Bloomberg's School of Environmental Health Sciences Department and the Health Policy and Management Departments. She is also Director of JHU's Center for a Livable Future's Food System Sustainability and Public Health Program.
