# New WellSpan Grant Available: Presentation from Joe Anne Ward-Cottrell

- A Change: old community grant → Inspire Grant
- WellSpan has new focus on food security
  - The goal is to reach people on an individual level, connecting them with food and other community resources to address their health concerns
- NEW! Imagine Grant:
  - Purpose: address issues of food insecurity
  - o 50k-150k per year, up to 3 years
  - o Can be a collaborative effort between agencies
    - Potential for easy collaboration between Franklin and Adams counties
  - o Timeline:
    - Application due March 1<sup>st</sup> (online through AmpliFund)
    - Notified in July
    - Projects begin Sept. 1<sup>st</sup>
    - Reporting due March & Sept. '23
  - Goal(s) to address:
    - Response to patient care
      - Diabetes and childhood obesity are strongly linked to food insecurity
    - Navigation to new/existing resources
      - Increasing WIC and SNAP enrollment
    - Build capacity & strength of community food distribution through local, regional, and national partnerships

- Criteria: Collaborative, innovative, impact/outcome focused (measurable), sustainable, aligned projects (align w/ food access groups, ie: FPC)

- CPFB has mentioned applying to do hunger mapping in several counties

#### Goals for this Year

- Restructuring the FPC into focused committees
  - Committees: Dashboard/Website (Jay), Policy (Ryan), Local Food Guide (Tammy),
    Outreach (Yeimi), FPC Food Programs (Kathy)
    - Ryan: the goal for the policy committee is to act like a grassroots movement that can focus on food issues outside of food security (if there's interest), like farm preservation
  - o Tammy sent out committee interest survey to FPC email list
    - 6 responses so far
    - Most interested in participating outside of normal work hours
