Presentation from Teresa Rogers (YWCA Adams County)

- Initiated a farm to table program last year through \$1,000 grant
- During the beginning of the pandemic, converted sandbox to box garden
- Partnered with Master Gardeners to get it started
- Goals:
 - Educate kids on local food and where it comes from
 - Serve local, healthy foods to kids and adults
 - Increase community involvement with YWCA
- Lots of stem activities with kids (measuring, weighing, etc.)
- Kids try different foods in various ways and journal to track it all
- 22 harvest dates last year; various fruits and veggies
- Short Term Expansion Goals:
 - Just wrote a \$3,000 grant to the Whole Kids Foundation to fund irrigation systems
 - Would like to increase to 7 total beds
 - Hoping expand program to Fairfield (currently in Adams Commons Business Park)
 - They'll convert sandboxes
 - Working with Walmart for soil and tools
- Long Term Expansion Goals:
 - o To work with local farmers for education and field trips for kids
 - To eventually start composting
 - o To have a fruit stand up and running for kids to sell what they grow
 - o To help families with food insecurity by providing food to them

- Thoughts from the council:
 - o A youth farm stand would be a great highlight at young entrepreneur day at ACFM
 - o Potential connections to PSE with additional classes and tastings for families
